CONTACT

I'm being referred to social prescribing

Client



- I see my GP because I'm feeling low after my Mum died
- I now live alone and miss my Mum who I lived with and was my closest relative
- I'm told about social prescribing as my GP thinks it might be helpful
- I discuss my Asperger's with my GP who says they'll include it as part of the referral
- I agree to start social prescribing and am told
 I'll be contacted by a Link Worker

GP



- I see my patient who tells me about how they're feeling low
- I think that they might benefit from social prescribing
- I tell my patient about social prescribing and they agree to give it a go
- I pull together a referral including what I see as the patients presenting need and include details about their Asperger's
- I send the referral to a local social prescribing service

CONSULTATION

I'm contacted by a Link Worker

Client



- I'm phoned a few times by my Link Worker but feel really uncomfortable talking on the phone
- My Link Worker picks up that I feel uncomfortable so arranges a time with me to visit me at home
- I meet my Link Worker who talks to me about what social prescribing is and how it might help me
- I feel quite overwhelmed talking about my feelings and my Mum
- I'm shown some leaflets about services which might be of interest but I couldn't focus on them
- My Link Worker doesn't push me to make any decisions and instead says we can talk which makes me feel calmer
- I send some messages to my Link Worker and we meet a few more times, one of them outside in a park which I enjoy
- I feel much more comfortable and am able to express myself clearer
- I agree to try a bereavement service after a bit of time to think about it
- I'm asked a series of questions about my wellbeing

Link Worker



- I receive a referral from a GP that has information about Alan
- I check the referral to find out more about Alan and notice he has Asperger's
- I check to see if he has a care and support plan but notice that he doesn't
- I think about some services that Alan might benefit from before I contact Alan
- I get in touch with Alan but notice he isn't comfortable on the phone. I update his contact preferences and meet in person
- After some relationship building, I discuss bereavement counselling with Alan
- I ask Alan ONS4 questions and record them as well as what he sees as his goals

INTERVENTIONS

I attend and speak to services that I am referred to

Client



- I sign up for the bereavement service but I feel nervous about it
- I find the sessions really helpful and I feel a bit better than I used to
- I meet lots of people who are just like me
- I feel much more confident and become a lot more vocal at the sessions
- I tell my Link Worker about how I'm getting on

Service Provider



- I receive a referral from a Link Worker
- I check the information about the client including their demographic information and their individual requirements
- II read that Alan has just lost his Mum and that he feels lonely
- I note that he has Asperger's and think about the best group to put him in
- I let Alan know about the times and dates of the counselling sessions and he lets's me know which he wants to attend
- When he attends, I record his attendance and send notes on his progress back to the Link Worker

FOLLOW-UP

I keep in contact with my Link Worker, meeting more times

Client



- I keep messaging my Link Worker and we meet regularly
- I like meeting my Link Worker I feel a bit more confident every time we meet
- I ask my Link Worker about other services they think might be helpful – My mum used to do all the finances and I need help to do this.
- I join a community service group called Life Rooms
- I ask to try more activities as I want to meet more people and try new things
- I'm asked a series of questions about my wellbeing (similarly to first meeting)

Link Worker



- I read the notes and progress that the service provider sends back and add to Alan's record
- I feel great seeing how much he's progressing
- I contact Alan often to stay in touch and make notes on any progress
- I ask him ONS4 questions every now and again which I make a record of
- I ask whether any of his goals or action plans have changed
- We identify another need for help managing his finances
- I agree to signpost Alan to the Citizens
 Advice Bureau Managing Finance course

Link Worker

OUTCOMES

I complete my course of social prescribing

Client

- I feel confident to attend the groups on my own
- I'm really pleased I decided to do social prescribing
- I'm really grateful to my Link Worker who has helped me so much
- I discuss with my Link Worker about completing my course of social prescribing
- I'm asked a series of questions about my wellbeing
- They make me aware that some information will be sent back to my GP so they know how I've progressed
- I'm happy for the information to be sent back and know that if I need support again, I can contact my GP for referral
- My GP is sent a conclusion message and I'm sent a copy

Link Worker

- I discuss concluding the Social Prescribing and Link worker support with Alan
- I ask Alan the ONS4 questions for the last time
- I make my final progress notes and prepare a message which I check with Alan is ok to share with his GP
- I send back key data to the GP with my summary and a copy to Alan

GP

- I receive a conclusion message from Alan's Link Worker
- The message includes any updated findings as well as how Alan is progressed
- I'm pleased to see how far Alan has come
- I add the information to his GP record (which will automatically update his shared care record)
